Dear Dr. Humes:

I am writing to confirm our recent discussions regarding the rescheduling of your deposition. We are now planning to conduct the deposition on Tuesday, February, 13, 1996, at 10:00 a.m. The deposition will be held at the National Archives in its College Park facility.

In regard to your travel arrangements, we are willing to send you a plane ticket and make arrangements for hotel accommodations. You expressed a current preference for driving to Washington and receiving a reimbursement for mileage. This is perfectly acceptable and we can reimburse you up to the amount of a round-trip, government-rate plane ticket (which currently is \$442.00). Unless we hear from you further, we will assume that you will be making your own arrangements and that we will reimburse you upon your arrival.

If you wish, you may take a taxicab from the place you are staying in the D.C. area to the National Archives at College Park and we will reimburse you for that expense as well. Parking is easily available at the Archives II building. I am enclosing a map showing the facility.

You should feel free to bring an attorney to represent <u>you</u> at the deposition if you so desire, but there is no obligation to do so. I roughly estimate that the deposition will last approximately four hours, but that it may take longer. We will be pleased to make arrangements for your lunch at the Archives.
