Thanks very much for letting me see this proof. I agree that it is a very well reasoned and excellent summary of the critics and their cases. Maybe Professor Goodhart would be a good man to participate in our project. We will talk to him as well as Lord Devlin.

As we get into the pathology side of the case it seems more important than ever for us to get a statement -- if possible -- from Humes, Boswell and Finck that examination of the X-rays and color pictures does not change their findings and we certainly would appreciate your assistance in obtaining same. All three have absolutely refused to be interviewed and Dr. Humes would not even see one of our producers in person, preferring to talk on the telephone. (I have been told, by a man who is a personal friend of Dr. Humes, that he says one of the X-rays shows a wire left in the bullet path through the neck. If this is indeed true, publication of same would resolve forever the discussion about back versus neck wound and generally settle the dust about the autopsy.)
