simply for the sake of my own
convenience, I'll wait until such
time as you formally invite us
to the Embassy for the final
formalities, just before we
leave the Soviet Union.

I have received notification
from the San Antonio, Texas
office of immigration, that
my wife's visa petition was
Accepted, they also wrote
that they shall notify the
Embassy in Moscow so I

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assure you will shortly give
the go-ahead for us to leave.

In case your letter to this
effect crosses mine, I assure
you that as soon as we
complete our personal affairs,
we shall follow your
instructions, as given in
your letter of March 9th,
and come to Moscow.

I received the notification
from Tefas on March 15th.
