Dear Mr. Oswald:

We have your letter of March 12, 1961 in which you state that it would not be convenient for you to visit the Embassy in Moscow, and that you do not believe that it would be appropriate to request permission from the Soviet authorities in Minsk to travel to Nescow for this purpose.

The Soviet Ministry of Foreign Affairs has always assured the Embassy that it interposes no objections or obstacles to visits to the Embassy on the part of American citizens in the Soviet Union. As stated in our previous letter a final determination of your present American citizenship actuae can only be made on the basis of a personal interview. Cortain statements of legal force relating to your citizenship actus should be made under oath in the presence of a consular officer.

We suggest that you inform us in advance of any intention to visit the Embassy so as to be assured of an appointment without delay. You may, however, drop in at my time during normal office hours. You may wish to present this letter to the authorities in Minsk in connection with an application for permission to travel to Mescow.
