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November, 1960, then Castro confiscated all of his assets, including his home in Havana, his country estate outside of Havena, and all of his other properties, bank secount, etc.

Mr. Poortgues, Sr. stated that Sergio Aroscha Smith, mentioned on Page 15 of SA Vial's report of 12-3-63, was formerly the New Orleans delegate of the Gubbn Revolutionary Council, with offices at 5kh Camp Street, Room \$6, second floor, New Orleans, Le. He said that Arcacha was "fired" from his position as New Orleans delegate to the "CR CV by the organization" smain office in Mismi, because practically all Guons in New Orleans were against Arcacha and his activities - not because he was cooperating with Castro but because of his debonesty. According to Mr. Rodrigues, Arcacha was misappropriating the organization's funds. Mr. Rodrigues was of the opinion that Arcacha may possibly be now in Mismi but not at all certain as to this.

Mr. Rodriguez, Sr. stated that Carlos Ouiroga, mentioned on Pages 14 and 20 or SA Violts report of 12-3-63 knew Arosoha well and was with him frequently (very close connection) at 54h Camp Street. Mr. Rodriguez did not know what happened to Quiroga's connection with Aroscha after the latter was fired.

Mr. Rodrigues thated that Aroacha made frequent visite to the office of Bonny Caire, then located at 705 Cagali Bidg., New Orleans. He said Ronny Caire was the principal organizer of the organization known as "CRISARE TO FREE CUBM. COPYLITET", with head-quarters at Ronny Caire's office and not at 5lk Camp Street. He said that Rouny Caire had prevailed upon Aroacha to join or Decome a part of the "CRUSARE" oven after he was fired as New Orleans delegate to the "CURAN REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL", against the opinion of the Cuban.

According to Mr. Rodrigues, Sr., Carlos quirogs was not an actual member of either the "CRUSADE FORRES CUBA" or the "CUBAN HEVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" but participated in meetings held for the purpose of promoting unity among or between the several local anti-dustry organizations such as the "CUBAN REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" and the "STOLMARY REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL".

Mr. Rodrigues, Sr. stated that the "CRUSALE TO FREE CUBA COMMITTER" was founded primarily to raise funds with which to buy arms and supplies for use by the "LUDAL RENGULTIONARY COURCIL" and that the "CRUSALE" has no actual revolutionary activities of any kind against Castro. He added that the "CRUSALE" was, nowever, delinitely opposed to Castro and would offer cooperation in the overthrow of Castro.

Mr. Rodrigues, Sr. stated that Ronny Caire had a quantity of pumphlets or circulars printed, which he had distributed by hand, soliciting funds for the "CRUSATE TO TRIB CUBA COMMITTEE." A coording to Mr. Rodrigues, konny Caire showed that contributions were to be sent either to 5kh Camp Street or to the Post Office box of Sengio Arcacha.

Mr. Rodrigues, Sr. said that he had never seen Oswald in his life and only knew that Oswald had had a fight with Carlos Eninguier and two other Cubenn on Canal Street, and Orleans, for which he had been arrested on 8-9-63, He said that he had no idea thy

the "FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE" was using the address of Ship Chip Strent, Nov Orleans, former address of the "CUBAR RYMHITOMARY COUNCIL," an anti-Castro or inimation, whereas the "F P C C" was pro-Castro, Mr. Rodriguez said he did not know or anyone who had belonged to the "F P C C."

Mr. Rodrigues esteed that recent newspaper articles had indicated that Jawain's former landlady at New Orleans had stated that Uswaid's wife often attended meetings at new Orleans, yet she could only speak Russian, giving rise to the suspicion, in fir. hourisques's mind, that there must have been other Russian speaking persons attending such meetings. (Subsequent to this interview with Mr. Rodrigues, Sr., reporting, agent contacted Mrs. Jesse J. Garner, 1911 Magazine St., New Orleans, Oswaid's former landingly attended meetings at New Orleans, explaining that, as far as she knew, Uswaid's Wife very seldom left their spartment and when she did leave the apartment it was mostly to go to a neighborhood grocery to buy bread, milk, and items of that nature. The said she did not knew of anyone who would have looked after Mrs. Oswaid's ly year old child while she vould have been attending such meetings. It was her definite cellef that Hrs. Oswald did not attend sny such meetings and certainly not on a frequent basis.)

On 12-1-63 interviewed Mr. Manuel Gil, 912 Lyania St., New Orleans - Valenhono: 9Mm-1171, mentioned on Page 15 of St Visi's report of 12-3-63. Mr. Gil stated that ne did not know Oswald personally and had never seen him. We acid the had seen photos of Oswald on television and in nawspapers since President Fennedy's assassination.

Mr. Gil stated that he has been a member of the "GUBAN REVOLUTIONANY GOUNGLE" for about the pest two years. He said that this organization formerly had offices at 5th Cano St., 2nd floor, for about six months during 1961-62; that Sergio Arcacha Enish and open the New Orleans delegate to the "C R C." He said that Luis Ravel, Arnesto A. mouriquez, Sr., Armesto N. Rodriguez, Jr., Sergio Arcacha Saith, and hinself were authorized to sign checks in behalf of the "C R C", as was Carlos J. Grimader, GPA.

Mr. Gil stated that Corlise Lamont, publisher of the booklet entitled "the drime Against Cube" is a notorious Communist or so he has heard, He also stated that the "FAR PLAY FOR CUMA COMMITTES" is a well-known Communist front and it directed from Havana.

Manuel G11 stated that he is presently employed as Production Manager by "The InfoRMATION COUNCIL OF THE ARMITION", exclaining that he makes tape recordings of information received from relugees from Communist countries, which recordings are broadcast in Latin American countries, we indicated that some of these recordings are also used in some Louisiana schools, "Phis DirectArion COUNCIL or The Arbitiche, Inc." has offices at 620 Gravier Street, New Orleans - Telephone: 523-364m.

On 12-2-63 interviewed Mr. Luis Havel, 4651 Harigny St., New Orleans - Relephoner 282-7981 (next soor). This is actually the telephone number of Charles I. Camp, Hr. Ravel's som-in-law.

Mr. Ravel stated that the "CUBAN RENOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" had left behind quite a new proprience learners or pamphlots at 500 Camp Street when they moved from that accress, at which time the headquarters for this organization were moved to his home at 6051 Markeny St., New Orleans.

Mr. Ravel stated that Billy Monteleone, of the Monteleone Hotel, New Orleans, had been Chairman and Sponsor of the MCRUSAIC TO FREE CUBA COSTITIES.

Mr. Tavel stated that Sernio Arcacha Smith had a poor reputation for honouty incours as itanocial matuers were concerned; that Arcacha was suspected of having emborated some of the funds of the "OUBAN REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL." He had that Arcacha had allegedly gone to "tail about a year or so ago after he had been fired as delegate at New Orleans by the "G R C."

On 12-2-63 reporting agent received a telephone call from Mr. Armsoto Rodriguez, Sr. Pe pointed out that the "COMA NEWSCHTTOMMY CONSOR" had moved from 544 Camp Street, New Orleans, better than 12 years ago, whereas it appeared that the activities of the "FAMR PLY FOR COMMITTEE" here apparently occurred during July and August, 1963.

On 12-2-63 reporting agent also received a telephone call from Kr. Luis Zavel. He stated that he had looked up some records and determined that he took over as delegate for the "CUSTN REVOLDFIONARY COUNCIL," how when you have the rearrest moved this organization's office from 5ML Camp Street to his hone, he said that the "CHUSAIR TO FREE CUBS CIGNITIES" was organized shortly theresiter and lasted only about a month or so, hr. During interviews with Luis Ravel he informed me that he had left hew Orleans about a year or so ago and gone to Venezuela to take part in the anti-Castro movements in that country; that he overtaxed his strength by working too hard in such activities and suffered what could be classed as a nervous break-down. He is said to be presently under the care of a psychiatrist and to have divorced himself from any anti-Castro activities whatsoever because of his health.

On 12-2-63 called at the office of the Hotel, Motel, and Restaurant Employees' Union, Local #166, located at 5km (camp St., New Orleans, where I interviewed ar. Hotert Davis Ungre, Secretary-Treasurer, and Mrs. Helen McCarthy, Office Secretary, with negative results. They stated that they had never seen Lee Harrey Oswald and knew nothing of the

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WHAT. HAY YOR CUBA COMMITTEE" ever being at this address.

On 12-2-63 called at the office of Amalgamated Association of Stroat Electric Calleys & Motor Clouch Employees of Amalgamated Association 171s, with cifices on the second floor at Sih Carp St., New Orleans, interviewing Mr. George 2, Gay, President. Fr. Gay stated that he has been in New Orleans for about three years; that he does not recall over seels, Lee Lurvey Gayad in the Nowama Building located at Sih Carp Streat or classwhere in New Orleans; further, that he had never heard of the \*FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE.

At approximately 2:00 P. N. on 12-2-63 reporting agent telephoned Romry Caure, Advertising Aldroy proprietor, with diffuse at his home located at 616 Lumaine Et., How Orleans. In: Gaire stated that Sergio Arcscha Smith had at one time been a delegate to the "GLHER REVOLUTIONINGY COUNCIL" at New orleans. He said that funds collected by the "GRUSANE TO THE GUAR COMMITTER" wors deposited in the Whitney Rational Bank, How Orleans; that the drive to raise funds was not too successful end the crusade gradually "Folded up." He cald he knew nothing of Los Harvey Oswald ever having any connections with the address at 510 Camp Street, New Orleans.

On 12-2-63 reporting agent interviewed Mr. William A. Monteleune, President, Monteleune Botel, New Orleans. We stitud thather had been presunded by a number of his irriends to join the "GUUSANE TO ARES COUNTELL" and that he was chosen as General Chairman of the organization. Mr. Monteleune stated that the "GUUSANE TO ARES COUNTELL" was organized to rathe funds in support of the "GUUSANE TO ARES COUNTELL" were being used to defray expenses incurred by the "GUUSANE TO FREE GUAS COUNTELL" were being used to defray expenses incurred by the "GUUSANE REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" see newspaper, television and radio publicity, etc., etc. He stated that interest in the "GRUSANE TO FREE GUAS COUNTERE" soon faded and the organization "folded up." Mr. Monteleune could furnish no information re lee harvey Oswald.

On the afternoon of 12-2-63 contacted Gr. Sam Newman, 1337 Aithra St., New Vrhans, owner of the meuman Building located at 5hh Camp St., New Vrhans, and had him come to the office for interview. Buring the interview Ar. Newman stated that the "COBAL REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" had occupied office space in Room & 60 the Newman Building from October, 1961, through February, 1962; that the office occupied by them rented for \$50.00 per month; that the "C R C" failed to pay their rent monthly and owed him about \$250.00 in back rent then they moved. He stated that on 1-3-63 Ar. Carlos J. Wrinader, Certified Public Accountant, Audubon Bldg., New Orleans, who acted as Accountant for the "CUBAN REVOLUTIONARY COMMITTEE" on a voluntary basis, drew him a check for \$100.00 in part payment of the rent owed by the "C R C" and that he received no further payments from them, Mr. Newman stated that Sergio Aruacha Smith and Carlos Duiroga were commented with the "C R C".

Mr. Newman stated that the "CUMAN REVOLUTIONARY COUNCIL" Left a lot of literature in their office when they moved from the Newman Building; that when they failed to return for it he had it disposed of by turning it over to the Salvation Army or some such organization, Mr. Newman was shown a photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald but stated that He could not recall ever seeing Oswald anywhere.

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Fr. -awman stated that when the "CUBLY NIVELITIONAYY COUNCIL" vacated the Leuman Evilding they failed to surrender the keys to their office, adding that they had nid several sets of keys to the office. He said there were no indications that the fellow had used the office previously. Fr. emman described this individual as: 'bite; male; 22/2h; 5-2h; 165 lbs.; fair complexion; light brown or blond hair; spoke with a Spanish accent.

Fr. Newman stated that when last seen, Sergio Arcacha Shith claimed to be celling life insurance. The name SPAGD ARCACHA is listed in the 1962 New Orleans city directory with address at 1923 Duolessis St. His wife's name is shown as "Nariso L." and his occupation is shown as "Dark," The above address is located in a housing development known as "Parkchester Apartments."

Yr, Lewsan stated during this interview that one Jack S. Martin, who lives at the corner or Esplanade Ave. and N. Prieur St., had brought Sergio Arcacha and Garlos Surrough to him and recommended them to him as prospective tennus. We said that Artin had also brought them to Mayor Victor Schiro, New Grleans, and had helped them to get a charter or permit to operate in New Grleans. We said that on one occasion Quiroga appeared to have a short wave radio transmitter which he was trying to repair.

Er. Semman stated that he has not rented any offices to new tenants in the Neuman Building, 5h4 Camp Street, since about September, 1962. He could furnish no information as to why the rubber stamp inpression "F P C C 5kh Camp ST. N°- Okl'ANN, IA." appeared in the booklet "The Crime Against Gube" which had been recovered from Uswald when he was arrosted at New Urleans on 8-9-63.

Mr. Neuman stated that summone phoned him about three months ago and wanted to rent offices for night meetings and wanted to make an appointment to meet him. He said nothing transpirited as a result of this telephone call. He also stated that about four or five months ago another fellow (unite; male; about 37/38; 5-11; meedium build; light tilve complexion; dark eyes; dark brown hair) came to see him about renting an office which he wanted to use for night classes in Spanish. He said this critice rented for \$30.00 per month and the subject paid him \$30.00 rental and came back the same week-end to see him. He said this fellow later told him he had not recruited sufficient students and that he no longer wanted the space, He told Kr. Neuman to keep the \$30.00 which he had paid him as rental.

During the late afternoon of 12-2-6) reporting agent interviewed in. Ronny Caire, 616 Durains St., New orleans, where he resides and where he also operates an accertising agency. Ar. Caire stated that he seemed to recall loweld applying for a job with his agency while he had offices at 704-5 Cirali Bldg., corner Camp and Canal Sts., New Orleans. He said this was several months age and about the time Uswald had a radio debate over Radio Station WiSU, New Orleans, in August, 1963. He said this was the only time

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he had seen Oswald and for that reason he could not be positive in identifying Oswald's photograph that he was the man he had in mind, Mr. Caire could furnish no information re Oswald using 51M Camp Street as an address.

During the interview with Mr. Ronny Caire, he stated that Gergio Arcacha may be wanted on a Lyer Act charge; that Arcacha allegedly drove a car from Now orleans to Minni.

On 12-5-63 reporting agent interviewed Kr. Robert E. Levelle, Director of cinance, City of hew briesns, also Kr. Joseph Orlesh, Secretary to the Director of Finance, to determine whether the "FARR PLAY FOR COMMOTTIES" had applied for a permit from the City of New Drieons to operate in New Orleans. It was found that this organization was not of record with the Director of Finance,

On 12-6-63 CAIC Rice inquired of FBI Special Agent Paul Alker, New Orloans, as to the results of any investigation which they may have conducted in an attemnt to connect Lae Harvey Oswald and the "FAR PLAY FOR COMPA COMMITTED" with the address SML Camp Street, New Orleans. SA Alker advised that they had checked this angle out thoroughly but with negative results.

UNDEFFELOPED LEATE

The overall investigation with reference to Lee Marvey Orwald is being continued at New Orleans and in the event any information is developed which would place him at 5kk Camp St., New Orleans, it will be the subject of another report.

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
