VILLIAN SLOAN, 6964 Morth Greenview, Chicago, advised that he has known JACE RUBY for about 25 years and explained that both he and RUBY were raised on the west side of Chicago. SLOAN stated that during the time RUET lived in Chicago, he knew him as JACE RUBENSTRIN. He evolution that he, however, was more closely associated with RUBE's brother, EARL RUBENSTRIN.

SLOAM stated that in about 1953 or 1954 he an_icipated going to Dallas, Texus, to make arrangements to marry a girl then residing in Dallas. He stated that he, during conversation with EARL RUBENSTEIN, mentioned this fact to him and EARL in turn told him that he, KARL, probably would be able to secure employment for SLOAM in Dallas through his brother, JACK, who at the time owned and operated two clubs in Dallas. SLOAM stated that KARL RUBENSTEIN telephoned his brother, JACK, in Dallas and mentioned the fact that SLOAM was going to be in Dallas, and that reportedly JACK RUBY told his brother, KARL, to have SLOAM "look him up," as he could use help that he figured could be trusted.

SLOAW stated that he went to Dallas in 1953 or 1954 and was employed by JACK RUBY at both the Vegas Club and at the Silver Spur, a dance hall also owned by RUBT. SLOAM stated that his employment included taking tickets and generally soting as "a watch dog" regarding employee and customer activities in both the Vogas Club and Silver Spur. SLOAM stated that inamauch as his plans for marriage foll through, he quit the employ of JACK EUEY after about one month, and returned to Chicago. He stated during the time he was in Dallas he lived with RUBY in RUBY's apartment, which was located in a building next to the Silver Sour on South Irving (Dh.) Street in Dallas.

SLOAN stated that he believes JACK RUBY was set up in business in Dallas through monoy either

given or loaned to him by his brother, EARL. He advised that RUBY was a type of individual who liked show people and liked to be around show people. SLOM advised that to the best of his knowledge, no well known talent appeared in either of RUDT's business places during the time he was in Dallas. Fo recalled that during the time he was in Dallas, a could known as Collbleck Seven and made up of students from Southern Methodist University were employed at the Vegas Club.

SLOAM described RUBY as an individual who was more concerned with the trouble of others than of his own. He recalled that on occasion he was in the prosence of RUBY when RUBY cried, probably because of scae trouble that had come to a friord of his or in another case when a girl had "julicad" RUBY. He stated that RUBY appeared to be the type of individual that was very easily hart and would usually react toward the individual consing the hart. He stated that had no trouble with JADE RUBY, nor has he over known JACE RUBY to be involved in any fight with anyone.

SUGAN stated that he considered HUST as a loyal American, and that his action "forward LEE OSUALD" possibly would have been similar to the action any number of other loyal American may have taken if the opportunity had presented itself.

SIGAN stated that he never knew RUBY to be connected with any gambling activities in either Chicago or Dallas. He stated that he knows that RUBY hated "the hoods" in fact he did not allow any roughnedks to irequest either the Vegns Club or the Silver Spur. SLOAT stated that he has never heard any information concerning an alleged rape matter involving ACC RUBY.
