He stated this list of police officers was furnished to LEE DRAIN, Vice President, Republic National Bank; DEWEY PRESLEY, Samior Vice President, First National Bank; JAMES C. DYCUS, President, Oak Cliff Bank and Trust Co.; A. B. WRIGHT, SR., Chairman of the Board and TERRY DICKINS, Vice President, American Bank and Trust Company, and H. E. CRABBE, Assistant Vice President, Merchants State

He stated officials of the above banks reported they were unable to locate any record of JACK RUBY being a co-maker on any note of a police officer in their bank at any time.
