CURRY. -- but I don't see that my resigning could help the situation any. Officials have expressed their confidence in me and as long as I have their confidence and backing I will continue to try to make a good police chief.

Q. Chief Curry, when did you first start out in the law enforcement field?

CURRY. 1936.

Q. And how long have you been with the Dallas Police Department?

CURRY. Since that time.

Q. And how long have you been Chief?

CURRY. Since January 21, 1960. I was assistant chief seven years prior to that.

Q. Chief Curry, there has been much said about the extreme gallantry displayed by Officer J. D. Tippit whose funeral will. be this afternoon. Would you make one final comment on that before I switch this.

CURRY. Certainly. My heart goes out to Mrs. Tippit and the family. (Choked up) That's all I want to say.
