

## Who, after being by me duly sworn, an oath depases and says:

My name is Arthur E. Eaves. I have been a member of the Dallas Police Department for 181 years. I am assigned as Assistant Jailer. I was working in this capacity on November 23, 1963. Between the hours of 1:30 p.m. and 2:00 p.m., on November 23, 1963, I placed Lee Harvey Oswald on the telephone with the assistance of Patrolman B. T. Beddingfield, to make a long distance call to New York City, collect. The Homicide office had advised that it was all right for him to make any call he wished to make. I notified the City Hall operator that a prisoner wanted to call New York City, collect. I heard Oswald talking to someone after the call was placed. I have looked at a copy of the jail card used to record prisoner's phone calls. It shows that I placed Oswald on the telephone at 1:40 p.m., and the signature as shown on the card is my signature.
