By letter dated Jely 23, 1064, the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy requested investigation relative to six enumerated points. Them I concerns whether Captain Glen King, Dallas, Texas, Police Department, Dallas, Texas, obtained authority of Deputy Chief Ray Lunday or Deputy Chief George L. Lumpkin to permit newmen in The third floor corridor of the Police and Courts Building on November 22, 1963. Them 2 concerns a telephone call by Licutenant T. L. Baker, Dallas Police Department, on November 24, 1963, to the basement jail office.

Attached hereto are reports of interviews with Deputy Chiefs Lunday and Lumpkin with respect to Item 1, and with Lieutenant Baker regarding Item 2. FD-102 (Rev. 3-3-59)

RAY LUNDAY, Deputy Chief of Police, Dallas Police Department, advised that Captain GLEN KING of the Dallas Police Department never-consulted him for permission for television comeramen or other news madia to enter the third floor corridor of the Police and Courts Building, Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963.

Daputy Chief LUNDAY stated that the administrative offices in which LUNDAY's office is situated are located at the end of the third floor corridor. On the afternoon of Movember 22, 1963, LUNDAY related that Captain GLEN KING came to him and asked if it would be all right for the television cameramen to run cables from their truck to their large cameras in the corridor bringing such cables through the window of his office running them across out through his door to his office and into the hallway. LUNDAY stated this was the only conversation he had with KING and this was not for permission to permit the television and news media on the third floor corridor, but morely for the purpose of running the cables through his office. LUNDAY stated as far as he knew KING did not have to have the permission of anyone to permit news media representatives on the third floor corridor of the Police and Courts Building. He stated that as far as he knew KING acted on his own in permitting the news media representatives on the third floor corridor of the Police and Courts Building.

Deputy Chief LUNDAY stated he was not aware of any loose press cards or badges that might have been found lying in the basement of the Folice and CourtsBuilding, Dallas, Texas, on November 24, 1963.

Deputy Chief of Police GRORGE L. LUNCKIN, Dallas Police Department, Dallas, Texas, advised he was never consulted by Captain CLER KINO concerning television compresses at the Police and Courts Dullding, Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963. He stated that KING asked him no questions concerning whether the television or press man could enter the third aloor couridor of this building. LUNTKIN . laked that as a matter of fact XING, as far as he knew, was operating on his own and was directly responsible to Chief of Police JESSE E. CURAN since KING more or less handled the press relations for the Chief of Police. LUMPKIN stated that as far as he knew Captain KING could solely with the television and press people and he never heard of KING soliciting permission for these people to enter the third floor corridor of the Police and Courts Building.

Deputy Chief LUMPAIN stated he was not aware of any loose press cards or badges that might have been found lying in the basement of the Police and Courts Building, Dallas, Texas, on November 24, 1963.

Lightenant T. L. BAKER, Mordeide Dureau, Dallas Police int, stated he was one of the detectives in Captiin WILL PAIRS office on the third floor of the Police and Courts Duilding, Bullus Police Department, on Wovesbar 24, 1963. Lieutenant BANCA sensed that at approximately 11:15 a.m., Movember 24, 1963, he tale shound to the basement jail office and talked with Lieutenant WESSHOW WICCINS in the besement joil office to make sure that all successby measures were in effect. He stated he asked WICOINS if everything was all set and WILLES replied that it was and he relayed this information to Capterin WILL FRITZ. He stated this was as apar to acqually that was said as he could remember. Its stated he reported to Capcain FRITZ that "Everything is all set." He stated that his call to Lieutement WalGIT'S took approximately 30 seconds and that he immediately reported the results of this conversation with Liquideant WIGGINS to Captain FRITZ. Liquideant BAKER advised he was not oware of any similar telephone calls that were made to the basement immediately before the transfer purty left FRITZ' office on Sunday morning, November 24, 1963.

Licute and BAKER stated he was not aware of any loose owers cards or badges that might have been found lying in the basement of the Police and Courts Building, Dallas, Texas, on November 24, 1963.
