MARGUERITE VEA RIEGLER, in care of Smith Hell. SMU. Dallas, Texas, advised that on Friday night, November 22, 1963, she was at Phil's Delicatessen, 3531 Oak Lawn, Dalles, Texas, in the company of RITA SILVERMAN, a friend, BILL MICHOLS, DERNIS MARTIN and BOB SINDELOR (phonetic), sophomores at SMJ. She sdvised that they went to Phil's Delicatessen at approximately 10:30 p.m. to have a coke and sa they were sitting at their table a man walked up to the table and took their newspaper. The man opened the newspaper, began looking at it and very rudely eaked if he might look at their paper to which they replied, "Yes". She savised he looked at the amusement section of the newspaper and immediately went to a telephone located approximately 25 to 30 feet from where they were sitting and dialed a number. She advised none of the group paid any attention, and she could not state whether or not he actually talked on the telephone but that approximately ten minutes later be returned to their table and again asked if he might look at the paper. Miss RIEGLER stated permission was again given and he repeated his former action and about ten minutes later again returned to the table this time somewhat embarrassed and pointed out to them in the paper advertisements for the Carousel and Vegas Clubs. He asked them if they knew of these clubs and stated that he was the owner of the clubs. He made conversation concerning some musicians who had played at the clubs and then proceeded to make a third telephone call. She said that after he finished the thing telephone call he returned to the table to talk with one of the boys in the group about musicians who had played at the club. As he left the table he turned to the front page of the paper which was covered with nevs and photographs concerning the shooting of Presi dent KENWEDY and made the remark, "Wasn't that a horrible thing". Miss RIBBLER advised that on Sunday when the news concerning the murder of IEE HARVEY OSWALD was broadcast on television she immediately recognized the photograph of JACK RUBY as being the person who had been at Phil s Delicatessen on Friday night and talked with her and her company. She said while he was at the delicatessen RUBY was alone but appeared to be very familiar with the store and with the personsworking in the store. She described him as appearing as though he were at home. *

Miss RIBGLER advised she could furnish no information concerning the telephone calls or attempted telephone cells made by RUBY.

Detective MCSRAD M. SIMS, Houldide & Robbery Bureau, Pallas Bolice Department, residence, 8483 Sweetwater Drive, Dallas, Texas, was contacted for the surpose of verifying a telephone cell JACK RUBY claimed to have been made to Detective SDES during the evening of Nowmeber 22, 1964.

Detective SIMS recalled answering the telephone in the Homicide & Robbery Bureau, Dallas Police Department, during the evening of Rowenber 22, 1963, on one occasion, when the person calling said, "Into is JACK KURY. I know you are busy. I've got some sandwiches for you." SIMS said he told RURY the Romicide & Robbery Bureau Officers had already exten (in relays) and that the sandwiches would not be needed. He recalled he thanked KURY and that RURY and "Alright."

SIMS said he did not recall RUSY mentioning anythin; sbout Padio Station KLTP, Dallas, during the conversation, and he (SIMS) did not know what disposition RUSY made of the sandviches. SIMS advised, however, he gained the definite impression during the course of the telephone conversation that RUSY had already bought the sandviches and had them with him at the time he made the call to the Homiciade & Fobbery Buresu. He further related that RUSY gave no information as to his whereabouts at the time he made the above telephone call.

SIMS advised it is his best recollection the shows telephone conversation with HIBT occurred scentime between 9:00 FM and 10:30 FM, Rowember 22, 1963. He said it is also his definite recollection this call was made scattime prior to taking LEE HARTY COMMITS on a suserbly room in the Dallas Folice Department Headquarters for a "show-up," attended by Dallas County District Attorney HERTY MADE, law enforcement officers, and representatives of the press, radio and television media. SDEF wid he helped escort OSWALD to the assembly room where the above "show-up" was held; however, he does not recall seeing MUSY during the time be was escorting CSWALD to the assembly room. He said, in fact, he does not recall seeing MUSY in or about the presides of the Dallas Folice Department at any time Friday night, November 22, 1963. SIMS volunteered, however, it would have been quite possible for MUSY to be momentare around the Dallas Folice Department Friday night, November 22, 1963, vithout his SIMS, having near HUSY.

SDES volunteered he knows RUBY by might, and has known him
