On July 23, 1964, Roy William Pike, who also uses The nane of Mickey Ryan and Mike Pike, was located and interviewed by a Special Acent of the FBI at stockton cutney here he is presentiy employed as a car Ancicles, Califormi name of Mike Pike. Pike advised as follows:

He first met Jack Ruby approximately one year prior to November 22, 1963 , when he was stancing outside photocraphs of the atrip-teasers who werc then appearing at Ruby's club. He was approached by Ruby, tho asked him if he would like to see the show as his fucst. He accepted Ruby's invitation and was iater that day orfered a joio as Ruby's bookkeeper. He worked for Ruby for approxirately two anths until he left Dallas to take a job in Port Wortin, employed by Ruby he attended a few parties with Ruby.
