a customer for any reason, such as obscene language, he would immediately grab the individual and shove him out of the club and occasionally would strike the individual without first trying to reason with him.

LARKIN stated that by the very nature of his business RUBY made it a point to be friendly with police officers, and a number of officers knew him and dropped by his establishment from time to time. He recalls that one Ligutement JAMES GILMORE, of the Dallas Police Department Vice Squad, was particularly friendly with RUBY. GILMORE was occasionally accompanied by his partner on his rounds when he would stop by to visit JACK's place and often would view the show. LARKIN added that he has no information which would indicate RUBY ever did any unusual favors for police officers, in order to get them obligated to him and he does not recall ever hearing that RUBY would throw parties for police officers at his place or elsewhere, or ever picked up the tab for any sort of social entertainment for police officers.

LARKIN advised he did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and never had any reason to suspect that there ever existed a relationship or acquaintance between OSWALD and RUBY. He added he has no information concerning the shooting of OSWALD by RUBY, or how RUBY may have gained entrance to the basement of the Dallas Police Department prior to the shooting.

Mr. DOYLE STOKES, 213 South Dwing, who was reported to have seen MUSY on Sunday morning. November 24, 1983, furnished the following information:

Wr. STORES advised he is employed by the Voterans Administration Hospital where he is in charge of the Morguo. He works five days a week, Monday through Friday, and weekends when energencies arise. Mr. STOKES last saw JACK MUBY on Saturday afternoon, November 23, 1963, sometime between 1:00 and 1:30 PM, as MUBY drove his automobile out of the driveway which runs along side of the STOKES' residence. He knows definitely it was Saturday afternoon because he was called back to the hospital to work and after he received his call to go buck to work, he telephoned Mrs. STOKES to tell her that he had to work. Mr. STORES did not see JACK EUBY on Sunday morning Bovenber 24, 1963.

Mr. STOKES has known JACK BUSY for three or four months having mat him in the neighborhood when RUBY was walking his dogs. Mr. STOLIS knows nothing concerning RUBY's personal life or political bolicis. He stated he knows of no connection between BUST and LEE MARVEY OSWALD.
