"A vertal report of this interrogation in the Dutch language was written by rive, BRINKENBERG, duly signed under his oath of affice on the 25th of May 1764.

"After having brought back to their memory the journey to A exico, Mr. BRINKENSERG started to interrogate Mrs. Ada DE CUSA - BISLIF.

- Q: Can you remember with which transportation company you travelled to Nuevo Lareda?
- At Yes, it was the Transportes del Norte line.
- O: Where did you board the bus and where did you cross the border between Mexico and the U.S.A.?
- As My husband and I boarded the bus in Mexico City. I cannot remember the name of the town where we reached the border, but it was in the vicinity of livera Laredo, where the bus went after the barder check.
- G: Can you remember something about the procedure of the Immigration officers at the Mexican border?
- As I cannot recall this exactly. I think that I remained in the bus.
- Q: Can you remember a young man sitting in the bus, who get in trouble with the immigration authorities at the hexican border?
- At Yes, I remember a young man, who was ordered by the lamigration to larve the bus. I suppose that he was an American, apparently he did not speak Spanish. I did not hear what he said or what was said to him.
- G: Do you know the reason why he was ordered to leave the bus or what kind of trouble he had?
- At Ma, I don't know, but I got the impression that he had trouble about his papers, that his passport was not got for comelling the like. But I am not even of hids, it is just at incursion.

- At I celimate this mun to be not older than 30 years. He was slim and as tall as you are (reporter measures bare feet S foot, 10 inches). He did not wear a hat nor a coat. He was dressed in a sport shirt. I don't know where this man went. After the border chack we went to Nunva Laredo and there we shanged into a Greybound but. I don't know if this man also changed begges. I connot temember having seem him opuin afterwards. I suppose that this man entered the but in Mexico City, but I am not sure of this. I would not reconnize this young man and I did not recognize him from the picture you showed me.
- O. On what date and hour did you leave Mexico City and did you arrive in Nuovo Lareda?
- As We left Medico City on the 2nd of October 1963 about Br30 a.m. and arrived at the border in the night. About one hour later we arrived in Neuva Laredo. This was an the 3rd of October 1963, about 2:00 a.m.
- Q: How many people were these in the bus and where was your Stocz
- At I don't know how many people there were in the buz. I prosume that we were sitting in the middle of the hus.
- Or Whose did you buy tickets for the bus?
- As My husband took care of it. I think that he bounds them in Mexico City.
