The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent TOM E. NEAL:

AT SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS:

On December 4, 1963, the following employees of Braniff Airways, Inc., International Airport, San Antonio, were shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. They were unable to identify OSWALD at ever having been a customer or ever having approached the ticket counter of Braniff Airways:

Mr. GLENN M. HEDRICK, agent in charge of the ticket counter, advised that JAMES BRAYMEN who works at the counter from 6:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. was on leave and would ceturn to duty December 8, 1963. He furnished his telephone number as OL 5-1794. Ee stated further that ROBERT ROESLER formerly worked at the tiplet counter and was employed there on October 2 and 3, 1963, but had been transferred to JAMTO at Fort Sam Houston, telephone TA 6-5369. He further advised that WILLIAM LIMBERMAN who is employed at the ticket counter where hours are from 10:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. was on leave and would return to duty December 9, 1963. He stated that he believed LINDERMAN may be in Minneapolis and that R. L. STREET, one of the ticket counter man, would probably be able to furnish information where LIMPERMAN, who is a single man, might be located.

A 1. STREET advised that LTHDERIMI's parents have the same no as and reside at Dysart. Town, and that LTHDEFISH was going to wish his parents and go pheasant hunting and from there he was going to Minneapolis. Mr. STREET stated he felt sure that if LTHDERIMI could not be located at his parents' home that he could be located at his parents' home that he could be located through a close friend nick-ramed "WHITEY" who is employed by Braniff Airways at Minneapolis, "Minneaotas.

Mr. W. 1. CLARK, Hansger, American Airlines, San Antonic International Airport, on December 4, 1963, was shown a photograph of LET HARVEY OSWAID, and he stated it was not identifiable with anyone he had ever seen at the American Airlines ticket counter. Hr. CLARK stated that R. J. DISHMAN who works at the ticket counter, and J. D. UHGER, a supervisor who also works at the ticket counter at times, were on a deer hunt in west Texas and vold not return to work until Necember 9, 1963. He stated that Mr. DISHMAN's wife would probably know where they could be located. He stated that all other employees were available.

On December 5, 1963, Mrs. JAMES SRAYMEN was contacted at telephone OL 5-1784, and she stated that her husband, who is a ticket agent for Braniff Airways. was in Dallas and she did not know how to locate him but he would return to San Antonio on December 5, 1963, and bould report for duty at Franiff on Sunday, December 8, 1963.

Mr. JOHN H. McLEAN, Station Manager, Trans-Texas Airways, International Airport, San Antonio, advised on December 5, 1963, that he was on duty October 2 and 3, 1963, and occasionally works the ticket counter. He was shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and stated it was not identifiable with any person whom he had ever seen at the airport.

Mr. McLEAN stated that they keep a record of the names of persons who make reservations for flights on their airlines, which includes nearly all of their customers; however, he stated that at times a customer will purchase a ticket shortly before plane departure time and, in such instances, a card is not made on this person, and in such cases, the original copy of the ticket which is known as "auditor's coupon" is mailed directly to their General Accounting Office at Houston, Texas. This ticket will show the passenger's last name.

Mr. McLEAN stated that their office is open from 5:00 a.m. to about 1:00 a.m. The following employees of Trars-Texas Airways who work the ticket counter were shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD on December 5, 1963, and they stated that he was not identifiable with any person whom they had ever seen;

BILLIE BUSCH, who worked 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., October 2 and 3, 1963;

MICKEY AMACKER (did not work October 2 and 3, 1963);

On December 5, 1963, Mr. A. E. NOVAK, Station Manager, Braniff Airways, Inc., advised that their flight manifests are destroyed after sixty days. The October manifests will be destroyed December 31, 1963, and the November manifests will be destroyed January 31, 1964. Mr. NOVAK was requested to retain the flight

On December 9, 1963, JAMES BRAYMEN, Braniff Airways, employed at the ticket counter, advised he was on duty from 5:100 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on October 2 and 3, 1963. He was unable to identify OSMALD's photograph as having contacted the airlines office.
