According to your instructions, I telephoned Mr. Uswald at 0930 at hotel this morning informing him that the Embassy had received a telegram from his brother and asked if he could stop by the office today to pick up the message. He replied in the negative.

I arain called Mr. Oswald immediately thereafter, as instructed by you, to ask him if I could read the message to him over the telephone. His room did not answer.

At 1105 I contacted Mr. Oswald at his hotel and asked him if I could read the messages from his brother, that I now had two telegrams for him. Mr. Oswald replied, "No, not at the present time", and hung up.

I called Mr. Stornborg with the International Rescue Committee, 25% Park Avenue, Riv Tork, tolephone number OR 1-1/200 to find out whether or not their orpanisation was going to farmich the funds for Mr. and Mrs. Oswald's return from Russia.
