Ers. Oswald came in to discuss the situation with regard to her con, lee Oswald, who had gone to the Sowiet Union and attoupted to renourse his citienship in a visit to the Embassy on October 31, 1959. Ers. Oswald said she had come to Washington to see what further could be done to help her son, indicating that she did not feel that the Department had done as much as it should in his case. She also said she thought there was some possibility that her con had in fact gone to the Sowiet Union as a US secret agent, and if this were true she wished the appropriate authorities to know that she was destitute and should receive some compensation.

Hrs. Oscald was assured that there was no evidence to suggest that her son had gone to the Soviet Union as an "agent", and that she should dismiss my such idea. With respect to her son's citizenship status, Er. Hickey explained that he had not yet taken the necessary steps in order legally to renounce his citizenship. At the same time, we did not know whether he had taken any action which would deprive him of his Arcelcan citizenship under our laws. Hrs. Oscald conceded that there was a good possibility that her son was acting in full knowledge of what he was doing and preferred the Soviet way of life. If this were the case, she would respect his right to do so.

It was agreed that the Department would send a new instruction to the Debassy at Moscow asking that the Soviet Foreign Ministry be informed that Mrs. Causald had not heard from her son in several nonths and was very ancious to have word from Mrs.

Mrs. Osvald said that her address at the present time was Box 305, Boyd, Texas.
