

Transmitted herowith are copies of correspondence received from Mr. Osmald since the Debassy's communication under reference as well as a copy of the Nebassy's letter to Mr. Oswald dated January 15, 1962.

It will be noted from Fr. Oswald's letter of January 5, 1962, that he has been issued a now Soriet residence document which is valid until July 5, 1962, In his letter, Hr. Oswald sho informs the Debasey that he has received assurance from the Soviet authorities that he may receive coit documentation upon request valid for 15 days. The Erbasey has already more formally notified by the Hinistry of Foreign Affairs of the issuance to itrs. Oswald of a foreign passport containing an exit vies valid until December 1, 1, 1962.

Moreover, Mr. Osmald's letter of January 5 states that he wishes to dolay his departure from the UUR until his wife's immigrant wise documentation is complete in order that they say depart together. Mr. Oswald also indicates that his wife is expecting a child in March.

Finally, Mr. Osvald's latent letter raises the matter of a loan to defray part of the cost of air travel to the U. S. for himself and Mrs. Osvald.

Action Requested: The Department is requested to advise the Dabnesy as soon as possible whether we are authorized to make a loss for air travel to the Cowalds under the authority contained in 2 FM k23 without further reference with the Department. If not, the Department is requested to authorite such a loss on a contingency basis.
