On November 25, 1963 GEORGE WILLIAM FEHRENEACH, Jeweler, Nedical Center Building, Medford, Oregon, volunteered the following information:

"Ashland, Oregon November 25, 1963

"I, George William Fehrenbach, make the following voluntary statement to James J. Mullaney and J. Eldon Dunn who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have been advised that I am not required to make a written statement but do so of my own free will and I am willing to testify in a court of law to the information contained herein.

"I was born March 8, 1926, in Muncie, Indiana.

"When I was aixteen years old I left school and took a job with Sam Jaffe as a jeweler apprentice. His store was located on Walnut Street between Jackson and Adams Streets in Muncis, Indiana. There was a group of men in the neighborhood who talked to me about the Communist Party and about Russia and I believe that they were members of the Communist Party. They were Phillip Jasser, of Jasser's Clothing Store on Mulberry Street; Lawson Jaffe, who owned Lawson's Jewelers on Walnut Street; and Morton Standt, who owned Standt's Jewelery Store on Jackson Street, and he also owned Reger's Jewelers of Walnut Street.

"About six months to a year after I started work for sam Jaffe a group of people came down from Chicago and I believe they were going to hold a meeting in Muncie. The group I have named were going to attend the meeting and I believe the meeting had something to do with the Communist Party or with Russia. It was to be held in a union hall upstairs from the store where I worked or in the Jewish meeting hall. The son-in-law of Sam Jaffe was one of the people who came from Chicago and he brought with him a man who was introduced to me as Jack Rubenstein (bh).

"Last night I saw the picture of Jack Ruby on television and at that time I did not think any more about it. Today while I was a work it came to me suddenly that Jack Ruby is the name person who was introduced to me in Muncie, Indiana, as Jack Endemnated.

"As I remember it Jack Rubenstein came to Muncie, Indiana, thice with the son-is-law of Sam Jaffe before I went in the Navy. Both times they were there to attand a meeting with the group that talked to me about the Communist Party. I recall that Jank Rubenstein was in abow business in Chicago as he showed me a few card bricks and reading from a folded paper something I had writhen. He also brought with him a very talk bland girl who was in show business.

"I went in the Navy on 6-16-46 and was discharged on 6-21-46. I then went back to my job with Sam Jaffe.

"Showtly after my first boy was born in June 1947, there was another meeting held and Jack Rubensbein came again from Chicago with the son-in-law of Sam Jaffe. This meeting was held in the union hell shows the Jaffe store. The next morning after the meeting I was sent up to the union hell to get a chair that had been tabon up there from the store. Up in the hell I saw a list of names on a table. There were two typewritten pages of manes. The first mass set I remember them were Lawon Jaffe, Fhillit Jasker, Herbert Parol, Morton Farol, Morton Standt, and Jack Rubenstein. I took this list of names to Macwim Collins, an uncle to my miss, who was on the Muncle Police Department. He said he would turn the list over to the Pai.

"Tonight I have been shown the picture of Jack Ruby in the tregon Journal, 11-25-63, and this is a very good likeness of the person who was introduced to see as Jack Rubenskein. He appears older and the half line is a little higher. I have also been shown the picture of Jack Ruby on page twelve of the Cregonian, 11-25-63, and this picture does not look like Jack Ruby in the San Pranciscod Examiner - page D, 11-25-63, and this picture looks like Jack Ruby in the San Pranciscod Examiner - page D, 11-25-63, and this picture looks like Jack Rubenstein except the hair line is higher and Ruby appears hawden.

"After the emeting when I got the list I never saw Jack Bubenstein again.

"I never new any membership cards of the people who talked to me about the Communist Farty and they did not directly say PD 44-225

they were members but they told me I should join the Communist Party and 'get on the right side of the fence before it was too late.'

"The last time I saw Jack Rubenstein I would describe him as follows: 30 to 35 years of age, height about 5'10" to 6', 165 to 175 pounds, no sears or marks or anything unusual I can remember but he almost always were a hat.

"When the son-in-law of Sam Jaffe and Jack Rubenstein traveled from Chicago to attend the meetings I think they came by auto but I do not remember seeing it.

"I have read the above statement & to the best of my memory it is true.

FEHRENBACH advised that SAM JAFFE died in 1959 or 1960 at Mismi Beach, Florida, but was buried in Chicago where FEHRENBACH believed his Midow still lives. FEHRENBACH said that SAM JAFFE had two daughters. CHARLOTTE and another, name unknown, who was married to the above son-in-law. FEHRENBACH believed that the PAZCLs and STANDT are still in Muncis where the PAZCLs once operated a tewiry atoms at Jackson sad walnut Streets. FEHRENBACH believed its LAWSON JAFFE sold his store in Muncis and went to Dayton. Onlo, about ten years ago and that JASSER is december.

FEHRENEACH stated that in addition to serving in the Navy, with honorable discharge, he also served in the Korean War, 1950 to 1951, with hardship discharge. He married PHYLLIS SWALLOW, a native Muncte girl, on July 27, 1946.
