These circulars were taken from the possession of Lee Oswald by the New Orleans Police Department at the time he was arrested on August 9, 1963. They were secured by the Secret Service in New Orleans, Louisiana from the New Orleans Police Department on November 23, 1964, and forwarded to the Secret Service in Dallas on that date by a memorandum from SAIC John Rice (Secret Service Control No. 86 previously furnished the Commission). The pamphlets were forwarded to the Headquarters of the Secret Service by a office memorandum to the Chief from SAIC Sorrels in Dallas dated May 21, 1964.
