Mrs. ORAN PAUL EROWN, 101 Savannah, Waxahachie, Texas, advised that her husband was formerly employed as an automobile salesman for Downtwwn Lincoln Mercury, Dallas, Texas.

On the afternoon of November 22, 1963, she watched the television news concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY. When she heard that a man named LEE OSWALD had been arrested, she recalled seeing the name of OSWALD on a piece of paper that her husband had left at the house. When her husband came howe late that afternoon, she asked him about it, and told him she thought she had seen the name of OSWALD on a piece of paper, about two weeks previously. Her husband then told her that one of the other salesmen where he worked, had given him the name of OSWALD as a prospective customer.

Mrs. BROWN said that she recalled the name on the piece of paper was "OSWALD," and she thinks this name was preceeded by two initials, but she does not remember what the initials were.
