In accordance with your letter of September 10, 1964, attached is my affidavit that Lee Harvey Oswald was never an informant or agent of any intelligence agency under the jurisdiction of the Department of Defense.

There is also attached a copy of a report concerning Lee Harvey Oswald which does not appear to have been previously furnished the Commission. Otherwise, all known information that the Department of Defense has that relates to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy has been sent to the Commission. The Department of Defense does not have any information suggesting that the assassination of President Kennedy was caused by a domestic or foreign conspiracy.

SUBJECT: Investigation of the Assassination of President Kennedy (U)

- Reference is made to DIA Letter U-4336/CI-1 to the Scoretary of the Army, Subject: "Investigation of the Assassination of President Kennedy", dated 17 September 1964 with inclosure 1, attached, Latter from the Chairman, President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy.
- 2. All appropriate Army Intelligence and Army Provost Marshal Ceneral's files have been searched concerning information pertaining to Lee Harvey Oswald. There is no record that Lee Harvey Oswald was ever an Army Intelligence Agent or Informant.
- 3. However, attached as inclosure 1 is an unconfirmed agent report that Oswald ant with Guban Premier Fidel Castro in Mexico prior to the assessination. Although Department of State and CIA files reveal no record of Fidel or Raul Castro being in Mexico in 1962 or 1963, this information is included as information which is not known by ACSI to have been furnished to the Commission. Other than the above there is no additional evidence indicating a domestic or foreign conspiracy.
