The cartons in the area where the rifle was found, and also the cartons near the window where the spent hulls were found were dusted for prints. A pall print was found on the top northwest corner of a carton that appeared to have been used by the appears to sit on while siming the rifle. This palm print was collected and preserved, along with the carton it came off of, and three cartons stacked by the window apparently to rest the rifle on.

Liautonant Day returned to the Identification Bureau about 7:00 F.M. and storted checking the rifle for prints. Two fingerprints were found on the side of the rifle near the trigger and magazine housing and a pain print has found on the underside of the gun bureal near the end of the stock. It appeared probable these prints were from the right palm and fingers of les dervey Oswald, but the rifle was released to the F.B.I. to be sent to meanington, J. C. before the examination was completed and positive identification purposes.

Paraffin casts were made of Oswald's hands and the right side of his face about 9:00 I.M. November 22, 1963, in the Hoadcide Eureau office by Sergeant W. E. Barnes 598 and Detective J. B. Micks. These casts were sent to BOOTL November 23, 1963 for nitrate tests.

All other evidence collected by the brine Scene Bearch was released at 1:45 F.M. November 22, 1963 to Agent Vince Brain to be delivered to the F.B.I. headquarters at Washington, J.C.

Dear Mr. Rankin:

Reference is made to your letter dated August 28, 1964, dealing with the clain of Sylvia Cdio that Lee Harvey Oswald and two other individuals visited at her apartment in Dallas, Texas, on September 26 or 27, 1963. Sylvia Cdio in testifying before the Councission states that the man believed by her to be Lee Harvey Cswald was introduced to her as "Leon Oswald."

In connection with investigation requested in letter of reference, there are enclosed two copies each of uncoranda dated September 8, September 10 and September 11, 1934. There are also enclosed two copies each of a neworandum dated September 14, 1954, and the eighteen attachments thereto.

On September 16, 1836, we located one Loran Eugene Hall at Johnsondale, California, Hall has been identified as a participant in numerous anti-Castro netivities. He advised that in September, 1933, he was at Dallas, Texas, soliciting aid in connection with an anti-Castro cause. He recalled meeting at the woman, Hrs. Odio who lived in a garden-type spartment at 1930 Hagellan Circle, Dallas, Foias. He say d that at the time of his visit he was accommodal by Lawrence Howard, a Herican-Ancrican from Hast Los Magdles and William Septem from Arizona. He denied that Lee Harvey Cayald was with him during his visit to Mrs. Odio's spartment in September, 1963.

Hall stated that William Seymour is similar in appearance to Lee Harvey Cswald and that Seymour speaks only a few words of Spanish. In connection with the revelations of

Hall, you will note that the name Loran Hall bears some phonetics resemblance to the name Leon Cawald.

We have obtained photographs of Loran Hall and will attempt to obtain photographs of William Seymour and Lawrence Howard for display to Ers. Cdio. To are continuing our investigation into the claims of Sylvia Cdio with particular emphasis on efforts to determine if Mall, Howard and Coymour may be identical with the three individuals who visited her in late September, 1963. The results of our inquiries in this regard will be promptly furnished to you.

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SYLVIA ODIO advised that she resides with her four small children in a one family house at 4223 West Lovers Lane, Dallas, Texas. She stated that she is currently employed by Knoll Associates, Incorporated, 250 Decorative Center, Dallas, Texas.

Miss SYLVIA EUGENIA ODIO was born on May 4, 1937, at Havana, Cuba. She speaks English fluently.

SYLVIA ODIO noted that she is planning to move with her four children around the end of September to Miami, Florida, where she intends to unite her nine brothers and sisters into one family. She stated she does not have a house located as yet in Miami, but her oldest brother, CESAR ODIO, presently resides at 1600 Southwest 82nd Place, Miami, Florida.

Miss ODIO stated she is from a large family consisting of ten brothers and sisters, namely, CESAR, AMADOR, JAVIER, FREDDY, JORGE, SARA, ANNIE, MARY LOU, CRISTINA and herself. Her parents, AMADOR ODIO-PADRON and SARA DEL TORO, are still in Cuba. Her father is in iail on the Isle of Pines, Cuba, for being an enemy of the Castro Government. Her mother is now in Santiago de Cuba, Oriente, Cuba. She stated that all of her brothers and sisters are in the United States. Several of the younger brothers and sisters are now in an orphanage in Dallas. All of the brothers and sisters will be reunited in Miami, with the exception of one sister, SARA, who recently married JACOB MRIRR and who will continue to reside in Dallas.

Miss ODIO stated her father, AMADOR ODIO-PADRON, was active in the Cuban underground assisting CASTRO in the revolution against BATISTA. Her father was exiled twice previously from Cuba during BATISTA's era. After FIDEL CASTRO
