I asked Mr. Summers if he had in his possession the entire contents of Agents Sibot and O'Neill's account of the autopsy. He said that he had obtained such from a book by MR Epstein.

I stated that he probably recalled in Sibot and O'Neill's account that it was reported that during the latter stages of the autopsy a piece of skull, dimension, described, was brought to Dr. Humes.

Dear Mr. Ahlerich:

I received your letter dated December 16, 1988 enclosing the letter of Mr. MARK GROSSMAN, dated December 1, 1988.

As stated, GROSSMAN'S inquiry centers around that part of the SIBERT/O'NEILL Autopsy FD 302 which states "it was apparent that a tracheotomy had been performed, as well as surgery of the head area; namely, in the top of the skull." These were observations and statements of COMMANDER HUMES, the Chief Pathologist, as recorded by agents witnessing the autopsy.

I am enclosing a copy of a cover letter dated October 24, 1978 with an affidavit which is self-explanatory and pertained to an interview conducted on August 25, 1977. I retained a copy of PURDY'S affidavit which I returned unsigned along with the signed and sworn affidavit that I prepared and forwarded to him.

It is to be noted that my affidavit mentions the tracheotomy in Par. 4, Page 2 and Par. 3, Page 4. The surgery of the head area is referred to in Par. 4, Page 2; last Par. Page 3; and first Par., Page 4.

Although the Bureau had prior knowledge of my August 25, 1977 interview by PURDY and KELLY, I did not forward a copy of my affidavit furnished in October 1978, which I am now enclosing for future reference.

In view of the above proceedings, would it be possible for you to suggest to GROSSMAN that he obtain a copy of my affidavit from the Select Committee on Assassinations, U. S. House of Representatives, assuming such has been released under the Freedom of Information Act.

Your Bureau files contain a letter to me from former Assistant Director WILLIAM M. BAKER, dated October 19, 1984, relative to a similar Kennedy Autopsy inquiry and request for interview and my letter of reply to BAKER dated November 13, 1984.

I have received similar inquiries in 1985 and 1986 and given similar replies as contained in my letter to BAKER. My reason for not submitting to interviews, in addition to Par. 2 of BAKER'S letter, is that I do not want to be placed in a position where I am asked for my opinions relating to: the quality and thoroughness of the autopsy, the single bullet theory, Mafia connections, and other similar controversial vics.

To whom it may concern,

As a researcher, I have written to both the F.B.I. and C.I.A. requesting access to all documents publicly released dealing with the investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

If possible, let me use document DL 100-10461/cv, the "AUTOPSY OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY", filed by F.B.I. field agents Francis X. O'Neill, Jr., and James W. Sibert on November 26, 1963.

On page 3, paragraph 6, line 6, the report states, "it was ascertained that the President's clothing had been removed and it was also apparent that a tracheotomy had been performed, as well as surgery of the head area, namely, in the top of the skull." If this statement is true, then it is possible to speculate that the President's body was altered before autopsy. I have yet to go so far as to accept wholeheartedly this assertion.


What would settle the issue for me is to contact agents O'Neill or Sibert and, with the Bureau's permission, allow them to explain the reasoning behind their statement, which was made at the time the President's body was unwrapped for autopsy.

I personally do not have the addresses of both men per se, but do know that as late as 1980 Agent Sibert lived in Carrollton, Maryland. Would it be possible to write him and, again, with the Bureau's permission, have him answer what exactly he meant by "surgery of the head area"?

Also, if I may, I recently, through Senator Bob Graham (D-Fl.), requested documents released from the Department of Justice, including a five-page letter from William Weld, former Assistant Attorney General, to retired Congressman Peter Rodino (D-NJ). In the letter, Mr. Weld said that acoustical information dealing with the assassination were published in a two-part article entitled "Acoustic Gunshot Analysis: The Kennedy Assassination and Beyond", published in the FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin (November and December 1983, Volume 52, Numbers 11 and 12, respectively). Would it be possible to get ahold of these two past Bulletins? |||


I am requesting your assistance in a matter of great importance to me.

With regard to your inquiry, because of privacy considerations, the FBI is not in a position to forward the addresses of former FBI Agents James W. Sibert and Francis X. O'Neill, Jr., to you.
