It's already four months since
we put in our request for visit, I

gives you an idea how slow they can be. What with our going to have a baby in March, it's not going to be so convenient to come back to the States and try to start life over again.

I'll cost about \$800.00 to fly from Moscow to New York for two people, I don't have that much money, but I'm hoping that the Embassy will help ~~us~~ ^{us} but when we get out via's.

We have had our first snow here on Nov. 16 now everything will be white until about April 15.

Maria asks Vada to send her a few fashion magazines every now and then if possible.

Why don't you send me your shoe size, and I'll see about sending you some Russian boots, they are black, high [like riding boots in the States] maybe you can cut a piece of cardboard or string to show

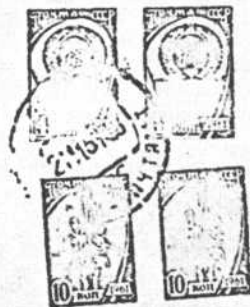
