MICHAEL F. HENCHMIN, Chief Probation Officer, Family Court of Cook Courty (FCCD, Etated that according to instructions received by him from EDUARD J. MERAD, Chief Administrative Officer, FCCC, he was making available the Colloving information obtained from the legal files of the Cook County Circuit Court Clerk's Office, which relates to subject RUBY and his brothers and sisters:

HENEGUAN stated that JACOB RUBENSTEIN'S legal record, Case Docket Number 90342, reflects he appeared in Juvenile Court, Chicago, on a dependency hearing, July 10, 1923, and that this was the first time his name appeared in court records. The petition which had been filed was to the effect that RUBENSTEIN, age 12, had not had proper perental care. At the time he was in custody of his mother, FARLIE RUMENSTEIN, 3647 Roogevelt Road. His father, JOSIPH RUMENSTEIN was residing at 1250 South Morgan. Judge H. STEPLING POLERCY made a finding of dependency and appointed the Jowish Ease Finding Society (JHFS) guardian with the right to place. The child's father was ordered to pay the Clerk of the Colors \$4.22 solit to be drawn by the JETS. On November 21, 24, LIC. W. CAGNEY (possibly a case worker) and that the case be reopened. A rehearing before Judge Victor P. ARMOLD was held Movember 24, 1924. At the same time a second dependency potition was file naming JACOB KEPECS, who had bocome Superinten at of the JHFS, as triving custody. Judge ARRICLD vacated all previous orders and set them aside. He continued the bearing on the new petition to December 8. 1924. The hearing on the second petition was further continued on the following dates; December 15, 1924. Camuary 13 and 27, 1925, and April 7, 1925. On April 8. 1025, the hearing was continued "generally". HENEGEAN advised that continuing the hearing generally meant that for all intents and purposes the case had been closed. He further stated the effect of the action on November 24. 1924, would have been to return the child to its parents.

There was no additional information in the legal files concerning JACCS RUEENSTEIN, HEMEGHAN stated.

With regard to HYMAN RUBENSTEIN'S legal file, Docket Case Number 60011, who was age 14, on December 27, 1618, IEMEGRAN stated that on Exy 1, 1916, a delinquency petition was filed in Juvenile Court to the effect that the Fry was incorrigible. His parents were indicated as JGZ and FMINIE RUBENSTEIN, 1232 South Morgan, Chicago. The finding on the hearing was "delinquency" and HYMAN RUBENSTEIN was ordered placed on probation to live at the home of his mother who was in court that day. On February 14, 1918, Probation Officer LUBA J. RCSIN recommended that the child be released from purcle to live at the Deborah Boys Club, 5930 South Fark Avenue. On February 20, 1918, Judge FOMEROY signed a permanent discharge for HYMAN RUBENSTEIM.

With regard to the logal records concerning SILUEL RUBENSTEIN, the brother of JACCS, Case Docket Number 90540, ISIEOUE RUBENSTEIN, Case Docket Number 90341, and IDA RUEENSTEIN, Case Docket Number 90343, in: HEMBOTAN adviced that their files were identical in every respect but their names with that for JACCS RULENSTEIN.

With regard to I.A DUEENSCEIN, Case Docket Number 33383, ENREGMAN stated that I find appeared in Juvefile Court on September 26, 1021, as a legender bearing. She was indicated as 12 jures as age as the time and her father, JOSEPH, resided at 128 South Horyan, and her nother, MANNE, resided at \$128 South Harphileld. The hearing was continued to October 6, 1021, at which time LUMA J. ROBIN was appointed EVA'S quardian with the right to place her. Her father was ordered to pay the Clerk of the Circuit Court \$3 per week to be drawn by LUBA J. ROBIN.

On March 23, 1926, a recommendation was made in Juvenile Court that the guardianship be removed and that EVA RUBENSTEIN was to be allowed to reside with Mrs. B. ZUCIERIAN, 1939 South Lawndale.

On April 21, 1926, Judge ARNOLD signed the release.
