## DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

This investigation was predicated on a telephone call made to SAIC Spanan, Los Angeles, from SAIC Bouck, PRS, on November 22, 1963, at 6:15 p.m. SAIC Bouck supplied specific information to SAIC Spanan regarding the telescopic gun sight and weapon used in the assassination of President Kennegy. SAIC Bouck advised that the weapon used was a 1910 Italian Rifle, 6.5 NN; Bolt Action, Clip Fed, No. 02766 and that the gun sight was a 1x18, segging that it had an inscription of Ordnance Optica, Inc., Hollywood, California, inscribed thereon.

SAIC Spanan requested SA's Clark and Horn to pursue this investigation and supplied them with the above information.

SA's Clark and Horn met at the Hollywood Police Station and were joined by Det. Sergemt Billy G. Malone, Los Angeles Police Department, Serial No. 5006. Det. Malone advised that he was not familiar with any ordnance optical businesses in this area. A check of the telephone book revealed a listing of Optitronics Corp., 1001 N. Orange, Hollywood, California. This address was diacked out and it was determined that this address is now a warehouse used for the distribution of phonograph records.

The telephone directory also revealed an Optics Industries and Gordon Optical Supply, both having the address of 635 Hollywood Rivd., Hollywood, California. Efforts to locate Murray Cordon, owner of these establishments, were made that night and he was requested to come to his place of business for interview. Hr. Gordon and his wife both came to their establishment later

that night and were interviewed. They advised that they had been in business there since 1953; that they are only involved in the importing of eye glass frames and that they are in no way involved in the manufacturing of ordnance optical equipment. They also stated that they had no information to may industries by the name of Ordnance optics Incorporated. Their files were checked for the names of Lee H. Oswald and Willie Randall but they were not of record there.

November 23, 1963, SA Horn interviewed Lt. Kanuel Pena, Robbery Division, Los Angeles Police Department, Serial No. 3226 and his partner, Sgt. Jess Conzales, Serial No. 3834. Through their informants it was determined that a Martin R. Retting, owner of the Retting Our Shop' 11029 Washington Slud., Culver City, dealt in telescopic gun sights and that her would be the logical person to whom to speak. It was known that Retting obtained his gights from Japanese company and that these scopes were used in great amounts on hunting mans.

That date, Lt. Pena, Sgt. Gonzales and Si Horn went to Retting's Cun Shop, 11029 'ashington Elvd., Culver City, and interviewed Mr. Retting. He stated that he is the sole importer of the gun sights that bear the inscriptions of "Lix18 Coated, Ordnance Optics Inc., Hollywood, California, Old Japan with a cloverlead with the initials enclosed of GSC." He advised that he had telephoned the FBI, Los Angeles, on November 22 and advised them of this fact after he had seen a picture of the assassination/weapon on television. Mr. Retting stated that he has been selling these fights for the last spree or four years, mainly to Klefinis. Sporting Goods, a mail order house at Side West Madison, Chicago 21, Illinois. Mr. Retting also advised that he Had sold a quantity of the sights to Dave's House of Cuns. Zild Elm, Dallas, Texas, but stated that Klein's Sporting Goods would be the logical place of business that Oswald would have purchased the gun sight as well as the gun. Retting said that the gun and sight are usually sold in a packet deal for something legs than \$20.00.

Retting said that the weapon used was a modified model of an Italian Carbine, a Carcano made in Turni, Italy. Retting stated that the rifle is delled a Carcano and or a Turni and that these names are interchangeable.

Records of Mr. Retting were checked for the years 1962-63 but no records of Lee H. Oswald or Willie Randall were found.

This information was immediately relayed to SAIC Spaman by SA Horn. SAIC Spaman then telephoned SAIC Bouck and advised him of the above data.

## DISPOSITION

Investigation on this matter is being concluded at this time.
