He will attend an 8:45 a.m. breakfast on Nov. 22 at the Texas Hotel in Fort Worth with the Fort 6- Worth Chamber of Commerce as host.

A Lalias poon luncheon, sponsored by the Dallas Citizens Council and Graduate Research Cente will be the next stop. Site for the luncheon is still uncertain. Gov. Connally said the Trade Mart, with a capacity of 1,800, is being considered but presents security problems because of its four bal-contes and 50 doors. The Women's Building at Fair Park is another

Robert B. Culturn, president of the Dallas Chamber of Comporers, and the chamber sould not be one of the cohosts for the President's visit but that the Dallas Assembly would be. The governor made no mention of the Assembly, which is an organization similar to the Citi-zens Council but for younger men. The Graduate Research Center

was invited to be a cohost, he said, because Gov. John Connelly's interest in education and the interest of the Citizens Council and Assembly made it appropriate.

From Dallas, the President will fly to Austin, arriving at Berg-storm Air Force Base at 4 or 4:30 p.m.

He will attend a reception at the Governor's Mannion from 6 to 7 p.m. and a \$100-e-plate Demoeratic party' fund-raising dinner at the 'Austin Municipal Auditoriura at 7:30 p.m.
