Marine Corps has requested the Office of Naval Intelligence to obtain a stined copy of OSWALD's statement of 31 October 1959 in which he reportedly renounced his United States citizenship. The Headquarters. U. S. Marine Corps anticipates that OSWALD may seek administrative relief from his undesirable discharge from the U. S. Marine Corps Reserve. 2. On 12 and 16 February 1962, Subject contacted our District Office in Japan and stated he received a letter from his half brother. Robert L. Carvald, 7313 Caveaport, Fort Worth, Texas, on 12 February 1962, concerning Lee Survey Oswald. Subject advised Lee Harvey Cavald is anticipated to return to the United States in the Spring of 1962. Subject further solvised Lee Harvey Osvald would be travelling with his Russian wife who had recently acquired a visa to enter the United States. Subject stated that he was unable to determine from Hobert Lee Oswald's letter whether the purpose of Lee Harvey Osvali's travel to the United States was to re-establish a permanent residence or to visit on a temporary basis.

3. Subject stated that he is semeduled to return to the United States in July 1962, but that he does not know the location of his next assignment. Subject advised Lee Barvey Oswald might possibly try to visit him at his next duty station and if this occurred, he would notify the local (SI office at his station concerning the visit. vers alaika

4. Subject stated that his cousin, Martlyn Murrett, U. S. citizen, formerly employed in Japan as a school teacher in 1959, has rince departed Japan. In this connection, your attention is invited to page 3, Report of Investiyation District Office 46, dated 27 January 1960, copy of which was furnished your office. Subject does not know Murrett's present address or if she has been corresponding with Lee Harvey Oswald.

5. If additional information in this matter should be developed, you will be notified.

The Communder, Marine Air Research Craiming, ands reasonable effort to inform you of your right to appear before the board in person, representation by sommel of your choice and to present any evidence or state-monte you believed pertinent to your case.

In the absence of reply from you conserming your rights as moted above, the board, nevertheless, convened and set on 8 august 1950 at which time a recommendation we submitted that you be separated from the Marine Carps Recerve on undesirable, this recommendation was concurred in by the Commander, Marine hir heavers Treining and approved by this Meadquarters. Jour disarerse as undesirable was directed by this Meadquarters on 17 august 1960 and effected 13 September 1960.

Your discharge certificate as undesirable is attached. Earliar delivery of your certificate sould not be accomplished since your whereabouts proficulty was malmoom.
